


The **Oh, I See! My Dog Taught Me** contest allowed people to vote for their favorite photos and stories.

The dogs who are no longer with us are identified with wings. Their lessons guide us daily and keep them in our hearts forever.


Oh, I See! My Dog Taught Me: All About Love

Baxter




Frank and Marcia Walker's Golden Retriever Baxter knew how much his humans loved him. They let him think their house was his and that they only lived in it with him.



Millee




Donna Williams' dog showed her how to love unconditionally, and Donna has returned the love:







What makes a good friend? **Malory Mildenberger's** dog Luna had all the answers:






Alishia Rea literally saved the life of her best friend:




Muffin

Tillie included. As I talk, she simply sits by my feet, peering into my eyes, and cocking her head in silence."


